



How to Add a Bleed to a **NEW** Adobe InDesign Document

Adding a bleed to the pages of your new print projects has never been easier – follow these few simple steps in Adobe InDesign, and you'll get that perfect bleed, every time!




To create a document with bleeds, open up InDesign

Select File > New > Document



Then click on the "Bleed and Slug" dropdown menu

In the section titled "Top," click the up arrow until it reads 0.125 in. The rest of the fields will auto-populate when you do that.

Click "Create"



That's it! The red line you now see framing your document means you successfully added a bleed. Make sure any colors or images you want to go to the page's edge extend to that red bleed line, and you'll never have to worry that your printing projects will come out with unwanted white space around the margins.
